

5. Which of your personality traits are you most proud of?



You are hereby notified that the PFSA Board of Directors has made the decision, at the recommendation of the Fraternal Activities Committee, to Postpone the PFSA 2021 Convention until November of 2022. The PFSA 2022 Annual Convention will be held at the LAX Hilton Hotel. The safety of PFSA Members, our Fraternal Family and the Community is of our greatest concern during the Coronavirus Pandemic.




